### **KG SECTION**

- Special days and events have become an integral part of learning and building a strong cultural belief and values in each and every child. **World environment day celebration ,Fun days with colours , friendship day, Character day, Spring Day** all gave our little stars hands on learning experiences.
- Special days like colour days, fruit days, vegetable days, etc are celebrated with special assemblies on every Friday to provide a platform for sharing their ideas and improve their communication skills.
- Kindergarten kids were caught up in the spirit of patriotism and celebrated Independence Day with great fervour. Students were dressed up as Bhagat Singh, Subhash Chandra Bose, Mahatma Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru and they delivered small talks to the gathering.

### **Here are a few glimpses of the activities and achievements in 2018-19:**

- The Academic session 2017-18 witnessed excellent performance of the students of Grade X & XII with the star students Nabeel Muhammed scoring 95.4 % in Science stream and Fathimath Suzhana with 91.4% in the commerce stream making us truly proud. In grade X, we have Parvathy S Nair, Amina Jubair and Athif Mohammed with 94%, 94%, 90% respectively. 17 of our students passed out with high distinction. We, the staff and students take this opportunity to congratulate the Students for their excellent performance and extend warm wishes for their bright future

- Nearly 30 of our students participated in the CBSE Kalotsav conducted by CBSE School Management association of which 6 of them bagged prizes in various events.
- Edubition, a science and Mathematics exhibition at Saraswathi Vidyalaya provided a platform where Amina Jubair of grade XI bagged Second position and Devanjana Of grade VIII bagged third position.
- In EUREKA 2018, a science-maths exhibition conducted at Sarvodaya vidyalaya was attended by 5 of our students and Saeed Jubair and Amina Jubair bagged first and second prize respectively in Maths exhibition and Siddique Jubair bagged third prize in Science exhibition
- Riya S George and Rohith NS bagged second position in quiz competition conducted by MILMA in association with National Milk Day.
- Our students participated in various quiz programs which includes Big Q conducted by Malayala Manorama, Sahyadri Environment quiz conducted by Sahyadri History Society, Tatwa quiz conducted by NIT, Calicut, Space quiz conducted by ISRO, etc.
- Oxfordians also participated in the Indian International MUN, an academic activity at Kanyakumari and KERMUN at St. Thomas School where students got the opportunity to learn about diplomacy, inter relations and United Nations.
- A wide range of opportunities were provided to the students for taking parts in various interschool competitions like ORATRIUM 2018, SRISHTI, TATVA, FUTSAL, CARMEL QUEST and other various competitions held by various schools and NGOs.
- Master Prithviraj R S, Niranjana S R, Mohammed Athif, Muhammed Nazeer, Ashiq Rahman of grade X qualified the first round of Movie making senior level competition of Design championship 2018, an interschool competition held across different cities in the country.

- This year we provided exclusive training by experts in public speaking, theatre arts, Yoga, Vocal music, Abacus and various sports and games and a host of co-curricular activities take place for grades 3 to 7 in the afternoon session where students polish their skills and talents.

### **Sports and Games**

- The school has always been taking initiatives to get the best talent in school arena. We have tied up with Specially trained professional coaches for training our students of grade 3 to 7 during the afternoon session along with the co-curricular training.
- The 13<sup>th</sup> Annual athletic Meet of the Oxford School was conducted at the university Stadium on 15<sup>th</sup> September 2018.
- Our school participated in the Basketball and football tournaments conducted by CBSE.
- Our senior and junior category players have displayed their team spirit in Football tournament conducted by Reliance Foundation youth sports at Central Stadium. Mohammed Farzeen of class X and Ahmed Suhail of class VIII were adjudged players of the match in the first and second round in the junior category. Mohammed Affan and Al Ameen of class XI were adjudged as the men of the matches in the senior category.
- Our athletes had an opportunity to participate in the Trivandrum District Athletics Amateur conducted at Chandrashekharan Nair stadium.
- School teams for basketball and handballs are given practice separately for boys and girls on weekdays after school hours.
- A demonstration of handball skills was displayed by the Airforce team for Oxfordians to provide a support in extending and developing the sport.

### **Special Day Celebrations**

Celebrating important days has become an integral part of joyful learning and community building.

- Environment day celebrations saw the children planting saplings in the school and they took part in the celebrations held in Mall of Travancore
- In Nature conservation day students had a campaign from class to class making them aware of the importance of conserving the nature and an oath was taken regarding the same.
- Debates, poster making, quizzes were conducted to celebrate World Science day, Ozone day, World Yoga day and World Ocean day to spread the awareness among the students.
- 72<sup>nd</sup> Independence Day was celebrated with a patriotic spirit by hoisting the national flag.
- A medicinal garden was made by the school Eco-club to enhance the students on the medicinal values of the plants.

- A two day Talent Hunt program, an Inter house arts competitions was conducted to encourage the talents in the students.
- The school under the guidance of Social Science Dept. honoured the non teaching faculties of the institution for their unfailing loyalty and hard work for the institution.
- 19<sup>th</sup> Kargil victory day was celebrated to depict the patriotism wherein an interactive session with the Rtd.Col. Mathew Varghese was organised.
- World space week was observed from Oct 4to Oct 10,2018in collaboration with ISRO.
- Various activities and competitionstook place to celebrate special days like Children’s Day, National Education Day.

## **Activities**

- The student council for 2018-19 under the leadership of Head Boy Master Ahad Bin Samir and Head Girl Ms. Amina Jubairwas officially sworn in on 29th June 2018. The Investiture ceremony was presided over by Brigadier Srikanth Joshi where he briefed about their responsibilities. It instilled leadership qualities in students and opened a plethora of opportunities to experience the administrative powers.
- During flooding, Oxfordians opened its doors to flood victims in various ways. Students, Parents and teachers together contributed towards relief operations for flood hit Kerala. Together the school collected and donated essentials worth 1 lakh and school itself purchased materials worth 2 lakh. These were dispatched to the disaster struck areas in Kuttanadu. Apart from this a cheque of Rs. 1lakh was handed over to the district collector towards Chief Minister’s relief fund.
- The Student council collected books and other stationeries from their fellow students and distributed to the students in need of 2 schools namely, HSS, Angadikkal and CMS LP School, Kollakadavu.
- The Science department organised an awareness program on Leptospirosis in connection with the ever worst flood in kerala.
- The cancer awareness program conducted was an eye opener for every child as Mr.Mahir Khan presented his own life story on the big screen filmed as ‘White Drops’. Children raised a charity fund and handed over to them for cancer victims.
- In commemoration of the birthday of Dr.Radhakrishnan, the great academician and former President of our nation, we celebrated teacher’s day on 5<sup>th</sup> September 2018. Various programs organised by the students made the day a cherishable one reminding everyone of the nobility of teaching profession. Teachers were honoured with mementos for their tireless efforts in nation building.
- Student council oriented the fellow oxfordians on the mischaps happening around us including missing children, effects of online gaming like MOMO & Blue Whale.

- The world is getting smaller everyday and keeping the global exposure in mind the school had an international exchange program with 18 students and 2 teachers of Ecole Jeannine Manuel school, France for 3 days. A collaborative cultural learning was extended wherein they had debates, group building activities, peer learning, house visits, etc. Our students were very excited to be taught by foreign faculty and had a unique multi cultural experience.
- E-learning through EDUCORE made an appreciable remark in the teaching learning process in the classroom. Along with differential teaching-learning, this academic year marked the beginning of periodic assessments through the same. We launched a new parent app called EduCare for effective communication and information.
- The exhibition of Arts and Science OXPO was conducted on Oct. 27, 2018 on the theme "Imagine-Invent-Inspire.". Various inter school competition on stamp and coin collection, Flower arrangement, digital paintings were also conducted.
- In connection with the Tourism Day celebration, Paryatan Parv was celebrated in the school to emphasis the theme of tourism and digital transformation.
- With great zeal and enthusiasm, Oxfordians hosted an interschool Sports quiz competition, SPORTIZ 2018 on 13<sup>th</sup> November 2018. Participant from around 30 teams of 60 participants from 9 schools took part and Chinnmaya Vidyalaya, Kunnumpuram emerged as the champion.
- ISA is an international school award programme of British Council. We are delighted to inform you all that we have successfully completed the Foundation Certificate programme and is on its Intermediate stage now collaborating with schools abroad.
- IBT 2017-18 results have shown consistent and gradual progress over the years.
- An orientation on Gender sensitization was provided to students upto grade V to help them identify the good touch and bad touch and to keep themselves safe.
- To stimulate brain activity and to engage mind, brain gym exercises are provided to students of grade III to V after the daily assembly.
- Abacus training is also provided to the students of grade III to V to develop the mental mathematical skills. Special program is implemented in grades VI to VIII to develop the analytical skills of the students

### **Club Activities**

- Shri. Sumesh Krishnan, a modern writer and poet kicked off the Literary Club activities such as Reading week and various competitions including a book exhibition.
- The Maths and Eco club were inaugurated by Dr. T R Jayakumari, former viceprincipal, Govt. Women's College. A maths magazine, 'MATH MAGIC' was launched on the occasion.

- ECO club members kicked off a Park cleaning program in the children's park in Poojapura, took part in 'Plastic Bottle Challenge'. They collected around 10 bags of crushed bottles and handed over to an NGO.
- Mr.Salin,a noted script writer launched the AEP club and Mr.Shajimon, the sub inspector of police, Fort Police Station conducted an orientation on Drug abuse and its consequences for our students.
